Monday 23rd July

7:00am: Morning Run - meet in the lobby at 7am


7:30pm COMPULSORY Special Lecture: 'British Intelligence and the Russian Threat', Professor Mike Goodman -lecture will begin at 7.30pm in the auditorium

- Professor Michael S. Goodman is Professor of 'Intelligence and International Affairs' in the Department of War Studies, King's College London and Visiting Professor at the Norwegian Defence Intelligence School. He has published widely in the field of intelligence history, including most recently *The Official History of the Joint Intelligence Committee, Volume I: From the Approach of the Second World War to the Suez Crisis* (Routledge, 2015), which was chosen as one of *The Spectator's* books of the year. He is series editor for 'Intelligence and Security' for Hurst/Columbia University Press; and for 'Intelligence, Surveillance and Secret Warfare' for Edinburgh University Press; and is a member of the editorial boards for five journals. He has recently finished a secondment to the Cabinet Office, where he has been the Official Historian of the Joint Intelligence Committee: Volume II will be published in 2019. This lecture will focus on the historical evolution of British intelligence and its focus on Russia as the main protagonist. It will consider some of the lessons that emerged from the Cold War and will relate these to recent events.

- Visit their favourite haunts from their days at Oxford on this walking tour, which starts at Blackwell's Bookshop.

7:30pm: COMPULSORY Special Lecture: 'How Shakespeare Went Global', Professor Emma Smith

- Emma Smith is Professor of Shakespeare Studies at Hertford College, University of Oxford. She has published widely on Shakespeare reception in printed texts, performance, and criticism, and her most recent book is Shakespeare's First Folio: Four Centuries of an Iconic Book (2016). Her lectures are available on iTunes U if you want to find out more.
- Again, there will be drinks after this event for those who want to further discuss Shakespeare.

8.45pm: Junkyard Golf (Westgate Centre) - meet in lobby 8.45pm, **£8 per person, requires ID** (as entry is only for over 18's)

- This tour takes you into the impressive buildings that form the historic heart of the University, including the 15th-century Divinity School, Convocation House, Chancellor's Court and Duke Humfrey's medieval library.
- Both Divinity School and Duke Humfrey's library were featured in Harry Potter as the infirmary and library- so a must see for all the Harry Potter fans!
